Emergency Action Plan

Description:

Creating a thorough Emergency Action Plan (EAP) for travel abroad is a standard practice in the field of international education. It combines all critical contact information in one document, as well as enumerating the concrete steps to take in case of an emergency.

Instructions:

On the first page of the EAP, include the steps to be followed in case of an emergency. **Below you will find steps that should be included**; choose the appropriate order for your trip, and copy and paste them onto the first page of the EAP:

- Contact local emergency services as required. NOTE: unless the emergency is sexual assault. If sexual assault, contact the U.S. Embassy Sexual Assault team.
- Contact your Common Ground International trip leader.
- In the event of a medical emergency, contact your international health insurance provider. Each Common Ground traveler must contact CIEE iNext at this number: 855-578-6398. This is used for health issues, medical emergencies, or in the event of evacuations for medical, natural disasters and political/security emergencies. *Insurer if not iNext* Name: ; Number:
- Contact your emergency contact at the university e.g. department chair, program director, program coordinator, etc. Name: ______ Number:
