COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to teach basic Spanish language to students that plan to work as health care professionals.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

In Medical Spanish (SPAN 410), students will learn to conduct a 5-10 minute basic Medical Interview in Spanish and to work effectively with a professional Medical Interpreter. In addition to learning the basic language skills necessary to conduct a preliminary Medical Interview in Spanish, students gain knowledge and understanding of different cultural perspectives to help them better anticipate and manage patient expectations during the medical encounter.

Spanish 410 is designed to develop the following ACTFL (American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages) standards and sub-standards:

- Standard 1.1: Students engage in conversations, provide and obtain information, express feelings and emotions, and exchange opinions.
- Standard 1.2: Students understand and interpret written and spoken language on a variety of topics.
- Standard 1.3: Students present information, concepts, and ideas to an audience of listeners or readers on a variety of topics.
- Standard 2.2: Students demonstrate an understanding of the relationship between the products and perspectives of the culture studied.
- Standard 3.1: Students reinforce and further their knowledge of other disciplines through the foreign language.
- Standard 3.2: Students acquire information and recognize the distinctive viewpoints that are only available through the foreign language and its cultures.
- Standard 4.1: Students demonstrate understanding of the nature of language through comparisons of the language studied and their own.
- Standard 4.2: Students demonstrate understanding of the concept of culture through comparisons of the cultures studied and their own.

ABOUT THE COURSE:

In this online medical Spanish course, you will learn the Spanish you need from meeting and greeting your patient for the very first time to managing follow-up care.

Specifically, here are the lessons included in this online medical Spanish course:

- Building rapport and trust with patients in Spanish
- Understanding patient symptoms in Spanish
- Present perfect verbs in Spanish
- Anatomy in Spanish
- Patient medical history in Spanish
- Pain & injuries in Spanish
- Preterite past tense verbs in Spanish
- Imperfect past tense verbs in Spanish
- Commands and conditional verbs in Spanish
- Conducting physical exams in Spanish
- Ordering tests and procedures in Spanish
- Direct and indirect object pronouns in Spanish
- Discussing diagnosis, treatment plan and discharge instructions in Spanish
- Giving anticipatory guidance in Spanish
- Scheduling follow-up appointments in Spanish
- Motivational interviewing in Spanish

ADDITIONAL COURSE DETAILS:

Each class session will include a combination of new learning, and lots of practice! The best way to approach it is to be relaxed and not care about making mistakes with the language. So, be ready to relax, experiment, and LEARN SPANISH!

Tips for success in this course:

- Language learning is both academic and experiential. You will need to memorize new vocabulary, think about how it pulls together to form a complete thought, and PRACTICE!
- Study little by little throughout the week in between practice sessions. Don't try and cram the information the day or morning before your scheduled practice session. In order to be successful in this course, you'll want to

- study the lesson content, complete the worksheets on each lesson and study the vocabulary before your live class session.
- Give special attention to the vocabulary delivered throughout this course. Study it Span>Eng & Eng>Span before you move on. You may want to use Quizlet or write your own flashcards out.
- ALWAYS attend the live class sessions whether you finished the lesson or not. Academic knowledge of a language is pretty useless if you've never taken the time to practice it.
- Study for your quizzes like any other test you would take that will allow you to focus on the actual questions and tasks to complete during the quiz instead of being distracted by not knowing certain vocabulary, etc.

- a) Comprehensive vocabulary quizzes: Each lesson has a comprehensive quiz on the vocabulary that is covered. These quizzes can be found at the end of each lesson.

Important notes:

- Your quizzes are a great resource to practice. You have 3 opportunities to take each quiz.

Formal and critical reflection assignment in pairs:

- Your reflection paper needs to be written with the classmate you chose to work with for your oral presentation.
- Your reflection should state why the topic was chosen and provide a summary of the 2 academic articles. For example, your topic is "la diabetes" so you should briefly explain the relevance of the topic and select and summarize 2 articles that discuss the topic in Spanish. Your reflection should show a clear connection between your topic and the content of the 2 articles you chose. Anectodal pieces are not accepted.
- Your reflection paper must be 2 pages, typed and double-spaced. APA style needs to be used.
- Your reflection should use formal Spanish. Please pay attention to grammar.
- Your reflection should have a cover page with your full name as well as your classmate's name, name of the course, title that reflects the content of your piece and submission date. Please note that the cover page does not count towards the 2 pages for content.
- Your reflection should have a reference list. APA style needs to be used.
- Your reflection should be submitted via Canvas on November 11th, 2025.

Oral presentation video:

With a classmate, you need to do a 15-minute YouTube video presentation in Spanish. You and your classmate can choose one of the following options to develop in your video:

- "Enseñar" sobre una condición: síntomas comunes, áreas del cuerpo afectados y cómo se afectan, nombres y descripciones de los análisis, imágenes, etc. para diagnosticar la condición, plan de tratamiento típico, y educación al paciente sobre la prevención y cambios de estilo de vida (para los que ya la tienen y los que quieren evitarla).
- Enseñar sobre un síndrome cultural (el aire, el mal de ojo, etc). ¿Qué es, cómo se contrae, cómo se trata, es una perspectiva/creencia inofensiva o hay algún peligro inherente para el paciente.

You should submit the link to your video to the "oral presentation video" section in Canvas on **November 14th**, **2025.** Please note that **no** reading is allowed in the presentation and each person needs to talk for 7 and a half minutes. Also, you may want to use a Power Point presentation or other visuals as creativity will be assessed. APA style needs to be used.
